## Fall Flower Show Rules

1. Entries must be in by 11:00 A.M. Thursday, September 9th.
2. Only one entry in each class to each exhibitor.
3. Entries open to all Sussex County residents.
4. Potted plants must have been in possession of owner three months previous to exhibition.
5. In a composition, an accessory is optional, unless otherwise specified - other foliage permitted.
6. A collection means one each of three or more varieties.
7. All specimen flowers must have been grown by exhibitor.
8. Specimens (3 of one color) to be named if possible.
9. Specimen exhibitors will furnish their own containers.
10. Containers may be called for after 9:00 P.M.
11. Seals will be awarded at the discretion of the judges.
12. The committee will exercise the strictest care to protect all entries but the Sussex Jr. Garden Club will not be responsible for loss or damage.

13. Dahlias, small flowered, display - at least 5.

15. Roses, display.
16. Lillies, display.
17. Any Annual not listed.
18. Any perennial not listed.
19. House plant.
20. African Violets.
21. Any other specimen.
